This House Is Not a Home

Author: Katłjà Publisher: Roseway Publishing; an imprint of Fernwood Publishing Genre & Subjects: Indigenous Resilience, Coming of age, Young Adult Age Range: Middle school onwards

Synopsis: After a hunting trip one fall, a family in the far reaches of so-called Canada's north return to nothing but an empty space where their home once stood. Finding themselves suddenly homeless, they have no choice but to assimilate into settler-colonial society in a mining town that has encroached on their freedom.

An intergenerational coming-of-age novel, *This House Is Not a Home* follows Kò, a Dene man who grew up entirely on the land before being taken to residential school. When he finally returns home, he struggles to connect with his family: his younger brother whom he has never met, his mother because he has lost his language, and an absent father whose disappearance he is too afraid to question.

The third book from acclaimed Dene, Cree and Metis writer Katłįà, *This House Is Not a Home* is a fictional story based on true events. Visceral and embodied, heartbreaking and spirited, this book presents a clear trajectory of how settlers dispossessed Indigenous Peoples of their land — and how Indigenous communities, with dignity and resilience, continue to live and honour their culture, values, inherent knowledge systems, and Indigenous rights towards re-establishing sovereignty. Fierce and unflinching, this story is a call for land back.

Author Bio: Katłįà is a Dene woman from the Northwest Territories. Previously serving as a councillor for her First Nation, Yellowknives Dene, she is an activist, poet and columnist and law student in Indigenous Legal Orders. Katłįà writes about Indigenous injustices with a focus on the North. Katłįà's first novel, *Land-Water-Sky*, won the NorthWoods Book Awards (2021).

He is the author of more than 25 books including *The Lesser Blessed* (also a feature film), the Eisner Award–nominated graphic novel *A Blanket of Butterflies* (with Scott B. Henderson), and *Three Feathers* (also a feature film). He is a contributor to the groundbreaking graphic novel anthology *This Place: 150 Years Retold*. Richard is also the author of five collections of short stories, including *Night Moves*, and six baby books, including the award-winning *Little You* (with Julie Flett).

Scott B. Henderson (he/him/his) is author/artist of the sci-fi/fantasy comic *The Chronicles of Era* and has illustrated select titles in the *Tales From Big Spirit* series, as well as the *A Girl Called Echo*, *The Reckoner Rises*, and *7 Generations* series. He is also the artist for AIYLA Honour Book Fire Starters, Eisner Award-nominee *A Blanket of Butterflies*, and select stories in *This Place: 150 Years Retold*. Synopsis: Based on extensive interviews, *My Left Skate: The Extraordinary Story* of *Eliezer Sherbatov* is a first-person biography of a teenager who had it all on the hockey rink: guts, drive, and exceptional talent. When a freak accident leaves him with a permanent disability and no feeling below his left knee, everyone believes Eliezer's career is over – everyone except his mother, a professional power skating coach. She teaches Eliezer to skate using the muscles in his upper leg, and after two and a half years of operations and rehabilitation, he returns to the rink to become one of Quebec's elite junior players. Still undrafted at age nineteen, Eliezer embarks on a professional career in Europe in the hopes of one day returning to the NHL. His travels lead him to France, Kazakhstan, Slovakia, and to Poland, where he lives and plays hockey just a few kilometres from the Auschwitz death camp, haunted by memories of the past. In its stunning conclusion, *My Left Skate* describes Eliezer's life in Ukraine and his struggle to escape from war after Russia invades the very region in which he plays.

Author Bios: Sara Florence Davidson (she/her) is a Haida/Settler Assistant Professor in Indigenous Education in the Faculty of Education at Simon Fraser University. Previously, she was an educator working with adolescents in the K-12 system in British Columbia and Yukon Territory. Sara is the co-author of *Potlatch as Pedagogy: Learning through Ceremony*, which she wrote with her father, and *Magical Beings of Haida Gwaii*, which she wrote with her stepmother, Terri-Lynn Williams-Davidson.

When she is not reading or writing, Sara can be found walking with her dog, drinking tea, or listening to stories and learning something new.

Robert Davidson is one of the most respected and important contemporary artists in Canada. A Northwest Coast native of Haida descent, he is a master carver of totem poles and masks and works in a variety of other media as a printmaker, painter, and jeweller. A leading figure in the renaissance of Haida art and culture, Robert is best known as an impeccable craftsman whose creative and personal interpretation of traditional Haida form is unparalleled. He has also been recognized with many awards, including being named an Officer to the Order of Canada. Illustrator Bio: Janine Gibbons, a Haida Raven of the Double-Fin Killer Whale Clan, Brown Bear House, is a multi-disciplinary artist and award-winning illustrator. Janine's works are inspired by the waters and lands of the Pacific Northwest, and their myriad colours, energies, and languages. Janine graduated from the Art Institute of Seattle and Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado. Synopsis: In Aboriginal[™], Jennifer Adese explores the origins, meaning, and usage of the term "Aboriginal" and its displacement by the word "Indigenous." In the 1982 Constitution Act, the term's express purpose was to speak to specific "aboriginal rights." Yet in the wake of the Constitution's passage, Aboriginal, in its capitalized form, was increasingly used to describe and categorize people.

More than simple legal and political vernacular, the term Aboriginal (capitalized or not) has had real-world consequences for the people it defined. *Aboriginal™* argues the term was a tool used to advance Canada's cultural and economic assimilatory agenda throughout the 1980s until the mid-2010s. Moreover, Adese illuminates how the word engenders a kind of "Aboriginalized multicultural" brand easily reduced to and exported as nation brand, economic brand, and place brand—at odds with the diversity and complexity of Indigenous peoples and communities.

In her multi-disciplinary research, Adese examines the discursive spaces and concrete sites where Aboriginality features prominently: the Constitution Act, 1982; the 2010 Vancouver Olympics; the "Aboriginal tourism industry"; and the Vancouver International Airport. Reflecting on the term's abrupt exit from public discourse and the recent turn toward Indigenous, Indigeneity, and Indigenization, *Aboriginal™* offers insight into Indigenous-Canada relations, reconciliation efforts, and current discussions of Indigenous identity, authenticity, and agency.

Synopsis: *Two of the Best in the Neighbourhood* is a backstage account of the creation and continued life of the smash hit play *2 Pianos 4 Hands*. (This volume also includes the full script of the play.) With contributions from the principal players of this story, including many from co-creator Ted Dykstra, Greenblatt takes us from the genesis of the idea to the blockbuster cross-Canada tour and to productions in the US, England, and Japan. A highly personal and subjective tale filled with anecdotes that span almost three decades, *Two of the Best in the Neighbourhood* is a glimpse into a fascinating chapter of Canadian theatre history.

2 Pianos 4 Hands tells the story of Ted and Richard, who grow up as "piano nerds," dealing with pushy parents, eccentric teachers, hours of repetitive practice, stage fright, the agony of competitions and exams, and the dream of greatness. As they mature, they become more aware of the gap between the merely very good and the great, and they come to the humbling realization that although concert stardom may be out of reach, they just might be two of the best piano players in the neighbourhood–and that in itself is worth celebrating.

Author Bios: Richard Greenblatt was born and raised in Montreal and trained as an actor at The Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London, England. He returned to Canada in the mid-70s and has been working as an actor, director, writer, musician and educator ever since. His work has taken him across the country, throughout the U.S., and in Europe and Japan. The vast majority of his extensive directing work has been with the development and premieres of original scripts, many of which were for Theatre for Young Audiences. His handbook for scriptwork, *Text and Context: The Operative Word*, was published in 2021. Richard has written and performed two solo shows (*Soft Pedalling* and *Letters from Lehrer*), co-authored two plays with Diane Flacks (*Sibs* and *Care*), and co-authored the immensely successful *2 Pianos 4 Hands* with Ted Dykstra, which they performed almost 1,000 times and has been seen around the world in hundreds of other productions. He has taught acting and directing at most of the top training institutions in Canada and is the recipient of numerous Dora and Chalmers Awards. Richard lives in Toronto.

Ted Dykstra is an actor, director, and playwright, and the co-founder, with wife Diana Bentley, of Toronto's indie theatre The Coal Mine. Ted is the co-author (with Richard Greenblatt) of the acclaimed and hugely popular play *2 Pianos*, *4 Hands*. His musical *Evangeline* was produced in Charlottetown, PEI for two seasons, as well at the Citadel Theatre, and currently he is composing music for Dion, a rock opera based on *The Bacchae*. Ted has performed on every major stage in Canada, as well as in film and television. He has directed awardwinning shows across Canada, including at Soulpepper Theatre, of which he was a founding member. He has received six Dora Mavor Moore Awards, as well as Gemini, Merritt, Sterling, and Chalmers Awards, and has many award nominations for acting, directing, composing, writing, and producing. For him, all of the above pales compared to being the proud father of Theo, Rosie and Henry.

Creator Bios: Jivesh Parasram is a multidisciplinary artist and facilitator of Indo-Caribbean descent. He grew up in K'jipuktuk in Mi'Ma'ki (specifically Dartmouth, NS) and currently lives and works primarily on the unceded Coast Salish Territories (Vancouver) where he works as the Artistic Director for Rumble Theatre. Jiv spent over a decade in T'karonto/Toronto working mostly in the independent theatre scene; there he co-founded the award winning political theatre collective Pandemic Theatre. He also worked as the Associate Artistic Producer at Theatre Passe Muraille. His performance work has toured across Canada, to the UK and Europe; and his research has taken him back to the Caribbean to Cairi (Trinidad & Tobago) Taino Carib & Arawak territory. He has been honoured with numerous awards and nominations including the Toronto Arts Foundation Emerging Artist Award, Dora Mavor Moore Awards, Jessie Richardson Awards, The Harolds, and the Herald Angel at the Edinburgh Festival. His work is also published by Playwrights Canada Press, and he has been a contributor to CBC, the Canadian Theatre Review, and Spiderweb Show.

Tom Arthur Davis is a T'karonto-based arts worker originally from the unceded territory of the Algonquin nation (Ottawa) with colonial lineage from the ancestral homelands of the Beothuk and the Mi'qmak peoples (Newfoundland). In 2009 he co-founded Pandemic Theatre, where he has created much of his work in close collaboration with Jivesh Parasram. Since 2018, Tom has acted as a producer for Why Not Theatre where he leads the company's Provoke Activities (initiatives that help remove barriers for artists). Tom's work with Pandemic and Why Not has toured across Turtle Island and overseas, including collaborations with Barbican Centre, Battersea Arts Centre, Buddies in Bad Times Theatre, Canadian Stage, The Cultch, High Performance Rodeo, Latitude Festival, National Arts Centre, PuSh Festival, Sydney Festival, The Theatre Centre, and Theatre Passe Muraille. His works for the stage include: *Mahmoud* (co-writer), *Take d Milk, Nah?* (co-creator/dramaturge), and *The Only Good Indian* (co-creator/co-writer).

Writer Bios: Donna-Michelle St. Bernard, aka Belladonna the Blest, is an emcee, playwright, and agitator. Works for the stage include *Reaching for Starlight*, *Cake, Sound of the Beast, A Man A Fish, They Say He Fell, Salome's Clothes, Gas Girls, Give It Up, The Smell of Horses,* and *The First Stone*. She is co-editor with Yvette Nolan of the Playwrights Canada Press anthologies *Refractions: Solo* and *Refractions: Scenes,* editor of *Indian Act: Residential School Plays.* DM is the creator of the 54ology and artistic director of New Harlem Productions.

Justine Shore is an actor and arts administrator raised in Sooke, BC, the lands of the T'Sou-ke Nation, to a Filipino mother and Irish-Canadian father. She currently resides on the traditional and unceded territory of the Lekwungen People, now known as the Songhees and Esquimalt Nations (Victoria, BC). She received her BFA in Directing at the University of Victoria in 2004, and in 2010 joined Blue Bridge Repertory Theatre as Administrator. In 2014 she joined Intrepid Theatre as Operation and Venue Rentals Manager. In 2020, she was promoted to the role of managing director. She has been an active member of Atomic Vaudeville since 2006 as past administrative assistant and current cabaret series actor. Her time with Pandemic Theatre was an honour and a privilege and she hopes that she will be forever entwined with their name as they destroy the system, one magical work of art at a time. Adele Noronha is a theatre artist whose heart will forever sit on the west coasts of two countries at opposite ends of the world. She holds a decade-long practice as a performer, thinker, and a dabbler in creation, curation, production, and dramaturgy. *The Only Good Indian* is Adele's first publication. She is grateful to the Pandemic Theatre team—Tom, Jiv, DM, and Sabah—for lending her their courage, talents, commitment, friendship, and this ferocious container to experiment within.
